

SHAC Meeting Minutes

February 23, 2023

The School Health Advisory Council conducted their third meeting of the 2022-23 academic year. Meeting was posted 72 hours in advance on the district website. The committee will hold four meetings for the 2022-23 school year.

All members present at the meeting. 1 guest was absent.

Call to Order - Chairman, Terry Hagler called the meeting to order at 1130am. Approval of December minutes. Motion by Angela Haney and seconded by Toni Diller. Recognition that meeting was posted 72 hours in advance.

Introduction of the committee members and their role on the council was made by each individual and led by Terry Hagler. SHAC purpose reminder statement was read and agreed upon by all members present. Introduction of topics to be discussed at this meeting include counseling, psychological and social services.

Mark Blakely presented Mentor in Care services information within the district, the goals of the program and how the program works. Presented a video titled Hidden Heroes that gave insight to what the program is and the impact it makes with both the student and mentor. Goal of the program is graduation. Last year, there was a 100% graduation rate. This year, the goal is 14 students to graduate. This is the second year for the program within the district. Currently there are 65 students participating with 85 referrals in waiting. Mr. Blakely closed his presentation with a letter from a student to their mentor. Parent, Max Johnson, shared his participation of being a mentor in the program.

Fabiola Terrelonge presented Communities in Schools services information. She provided a handout that listed the CIS services, campus specific services, the assessment tool, Panorama SEL assessment used to aid the student in areas of strength and growth opportunities. The program allows the student to set goals and select areas of growth. Currently there are 75 students in the program. She visits with each student bimonthly at a minimum with allowance of each student able to visit as needed. She discussed how other school personnel and programs bridge the gap between her services and the student. CIS also services junior high students. Angela Haney asked about resources for parents. CIS responded with parent engagement does fall under the CIS umbrella and welcomes communication and parent engagement. CIS reminds the committee the program meets requested guidance of school district needs/wants. Max Johnson inquired about grades with CIS program. CIS reports academics are a huge part as well as other components.

Mrs. Terrelonge gave a brief summary of the services Rick Sanders provides to students at his request. He is the district licensed professional counselor. His area focuses on special education, behavioral intervention plans, and all student support. His services are in a 3 tier system with Tier 3 representing constant intervention, Tier 2 as monitoring, and Tier 1 as the school as a whole. He reminds the committee his intervention(s) do not replace outside treatment and/or services.

Terry Hagler announced the next meeting as tentatively, April 13th. Planning the final meeting to be held in the press box at Hugh Sandifer stadium. A two week notice will be posted for future meetings. Lunch will also be served. No objection by committee members for dates, all in agreement. The April meeting will potentially include a tour of the facilities, guest PE teacher, and discussion of the approved textbook and health review.

With no further business to discuss the meeting was adjourned at 1214pm.
