SHAC Meeting Minutes Wylie Administration October 9, 2024

The School Health Advisory Council conducted their first meeting of the 2024-25 academic year. Meeting was posted 72 hours in advance on the district website. This marks the first meeting of the year.

Call to Order- Chairman, Terry Hagler called the meeting to order at 1125. Introduction of the committee members and their role on the council was made by each individual and led by Terry Hagler. Meeting minutes were audio recorded. Mr. Hagler discussed the plan for topics with each meeting following the Coordinated School Health requirements. Topic for today was Nutrition.

Director and Assistant Director of Food Services discussed all campuses in Wylie are under the National School Lunch Program. The NSLP offers low cost or free lunches to student's that qualify. Gave information on where to find applications for parents on the Wylie website. Applications are up this year. They discussed the new charging policy, which allows students up to 5 breakfast meals and 5 lunches that are reimbursable. Meals served in August were as follows: 38.4%-Free lunch; 6.2%- reduced lunch; 55.4%-paid for. They have seen an increase in both breakfast and lunch meals across the district: 18%-free lunch; 2%-reduced lunch; 79% paid lunch. Discussed problems such as, substitutions of food, paper goods, price increase, and substitutions. USDA information sheet was given regarding the Offer vs Serve with goal to reduce food waste while allowing students to choose foods they want to eat. Ex: choosing fruit or vegetable.

A la carte items are available and meet healthy choice requirements. Highschool has snack machines and drink machines with positive feedback. National school lunch week is 10/14-18.

Terry Hagler passed out handouts for October Fentanyl Poisoning Awareness Month. Discussed actions that Wylie is implementing through TEA. Wylie is also providing weekly or monthly mental health assistance. Guidelines and rules from TEA have been met.

No further business to discuss, Mr. Hagler adjourned meeting at 1156.
